## Roc Caivano Architectural Drawing Collection

It is with great pleasure that we announce the recent acquisition of retired Bar Harbor architect, Roc Caivano's work.

The collection spans 40+ years of Roc's work in Philadelphia and on Mount Desert Island. To date we have 120 projects of his cataloged and stored. We will continue to add more of his work as space is made available.

He worked alongside archivist, Hannah Stevens, to bring his most profound and expressive projects to the archive. The collection includes collaborative work with students during his time teaching at College of the Atlantic, plans and sketches for the Wendell Gilley Museum, a plan for a building at Dartmouth College, preliminary sketches for a proposed motel in Bar Harbor that was never built, and even a sketch of the front elevation of the Piazzi Chapel in Italy drawn for his daughter's school project.


